

ROAD RAIL AND RIGHTS OF WAY

WALK DIRECTIONS

Starting opposite the High Street car park, walk down Rolley Lane. As the road bears to the right take the short footpath to the left which comes out just before Rolley bridge. Cross the bridge and continue along the farm track which eventually bears left passing Park Farm House after about 400 yds. Leaving the track, a waymark now indicates the route through a small wooded area emerging onto Hollow Road. Go through the facing white gates (raise bolt if necessary) to Felix Place and follow the bridleway to Clark's Cottage passing through two farm gates on the way. At Crane's Lane go right and then turn almost immediately left onto an unmarked bridleway known as Sniveller's Lane. Proceed towards an unmanned railway crossing. Being careful to observe the notice to **STOP LOOK LISTEN**, cross the very busy line to re-enter Sniveller's Lane which is now clearly defined.

Arriving at the A12 turn left along the slip road to Kelvedon. After Crane's Lane turn right across what is now London Road and pass under the bridge carrying the A12 where a finger post on the left hand side indicates a path, (this was realigned in 2007 so may not yet appear on the OS map) leading to Braxted Road (aka Kelvedon Road) via a new footbridge across the River Blackwater. On reaching the Braxted Road turn left and after some 400 yards again turn left over the road bridge across the A12. The road now winds down to another bridge recrossing the Blackwater at Grey's Mill. Continue up Maldon Road turning right opposite the Library and Museum into Brockwell Lane. Carry on to a short footpath which joins Easterford Road. Here, go left and on reaching the High Street turn right when the starting point is soon regained.
